Section 1: Where are we now?

- This will show our current location, including the latitude and longitude.
- We will provide the approximate total distance that we have traveled during our journey.
- Maps will be included to show our position on our journey route, pointing to a more detailed diagram of our current location. Clicking on these maps will take you to Google Maps. The country flag of our current location will also be displayed.




Section 2: People and Culture

This section will focus on the societal aspects of the current location on our journey. These elements fall under the umbrella of Human Geography. According to the Annenberg Learner, Human Geography is defined as exploring "the relationships between humans and their natural environment, and to track the broad social patterns that shape human societies." Section 3: Nature and Environment

- This section will focus on the natural elements of the current area that we are visiting and treks we are taking. These are components of Physical Geography. According to PhysicalGeography.net, this is the study of "the spatial patterns of weather and climate, soils, vegetation, animals, water in all its forms, and landforms". Expect to see the topics below covered in our weekly education modules:

 - Animals

 - Size and scale
 - Ecosystems
 - Natural Exports
- Special focus will be on the environment and on sustainability practices, highlighting where the world is being threatened or improved.
